Class content:

Daily preparation and communication:

CLASSROOM PROCEDURES & EXPECTAIONS

ENTRANCE- Come directly into the classroom, get your folder and pencil and be seated in your assigned seat to begin bell work, music term of the day, and the first assignment.

TARDY POLICY- Students will not be tardy to class. If for any reason you are tardy, you must have a note from the teacher, attendance. Consequences for tardiness will be in accordance with the administration's policy.

STARTING CLASS- When Mr. Collins raises his hand; each student will raise their hand and have 5 seconds to stop talking. The students will then look up at Mr. Collins and listen for instruction.

RESPECT- Students will not talk while Mr. Collins is talking to the class or giving instruction.

FOOD RULE- No food, candy, gum, or drinks will be allowed class. Bottled Water Only!

RESTROOM RULE- Each student will be allowed ONE emergency restroom visit during each nine weeks. Only emergencies will be permitted to the nurses' office.

CLASS EXIT- Each student will remain in their assigned seat until the bell rings. Students will not line up at the door.

PERFORMANCE ATTENDANCE POLICY:

All students are required to participate in performances, which could be scheduled during school hours and after school hours. These performances are MANDATORY. Each and every student is important in creating a successful program and performance. The performances are a culmination of all of the work the students have been focusing on and will be treated like a final exam. Students will be graded on their performance, attendance, and concert etiquette (proper behavior and attendance until the end of a concert). Failure to attend a required performance will result in a 0%. If a student misses a performance they will be allowed to make up the missed performance via in alternate assignment. If the absence is excused (i.e. severe illness or family emergency), the student will be allowed to make up the missed performance without penalty. An excused absence will only be granted with a note from a parent or guardian prior to or immediately following a concert or rehearsal. Unexcused absences will result in a lowering of grade from the alternate assignment. Please note that Mr. Collins has the final call weather an absences is excused or unexcused. THANK YOU FOR CALLING OR EMAILING PRIOR TO AN ABSENCE WHENEVER POSSIBLE!

FORMAL CONCERT ATTIRE

- 1. **Ladies:** All ladies will wear black dress/pants, black closed-toed dress shoes, black socks if wearing pants or skin tone stockings if wearing a dress. Ladies hair will be pulled back away from the face or done neatly.
- 2. **Gentlemen:** All gentlemen will wear black pants, black dress shoes, black socks, and white long sleeve dress shirt, and solid black tie.

Students will be expected to:

- 1. Follow all directions.
- 2. Bring materials to class (sharpened pencils, learning notebooks, music).
- 3. Come to class on time and be in their seat before the tardy bell rings.
- 4. Be respectful of each person and respect the environment.
- 5. Participate willingly in every activity.

Students who choose to adhere to the above will earn:

- 3. Outstanding mark in citizenship

Students who choose not to adhere to the above will earn:

- 1. 1st Offense Warning by teacher
- 2. 2nd Offense Conference with teacher/detention and parent contact
- 3. 3rd Offense Administrative Referral

In addition to the above, the following clauses will be enforced:

- 1. Any student who willingly participates in an activity that could injure him/herself or others will be immediately referred to the administration and parents will be contacted.
- 2. Any student who commits a suspension / expulsion action as outlined in the MGLA Student Handbook will be immediately referred to then administration and parents will be contacted.
